When the year 2016 arrives, it will mark 70 years since CJM was organized. It will be 74 years since Margaret Ridgway heard the call of God and voluntarily followed her Japanese Sunday School children and their families into the dismal, abandoned ghost towns of interior BC. As a result of Japan bombing Pearl Harbor, in December 1941, the 22,000 Canadian Japanese, by its government implementing the War Measures Act, were expelled from the west coast. Do you know this history? Some of us have childhood memories of these turbulent time. God was still at work! A young lady, 27 years of age, heeding the call of God and choosing to live in an abandoned shack, spent her days bringing comfort and friendship to many children, young people and their mothers. Margaret has written a brief history of the challenges

apanese Gospel Church of Toronto had its beginnings by missionaries of the CJM in the year 1955. A number of those reached in the early days were young kika Niseis who were born in Canada, raised in Japan and later returned. Several of them made up the core of the beginnings of JGCT. Recently, we had a me-

morial service for a wife of kika Nisei and it reminded us that JGCT is built on their determination and faith in Christ Jesus.

At JGCT some of our Christian young adults, most who are bilingual, have started an after-service fellowship and study group called "Seed". It continues to be a very meaningful time for them.

Amongst the ministries involving the Japanese parents is one called "Parenting". It is a Christian mothers group studying and discussing how to develop good parenting skills and to instill Christian faith and values in their children. Two pre-school programs are offered on Monday and Tuesday mornings each week. They are called Aratama (Nursery Children's Circle) and Kohitsuji Hiroba (Drop-in). Aratama is attended by 10-12 mothers with their children and Kohitsuji by 18-20 mothers with their little ones.

Over the course of the year, we witnessed 4 baptisms. They were, Izumi Inoue, Hazuki Eguchi, Amy Wong and John Tamai. They have all been a wonderful encouragement to everyone in the

We now have six small groups in the Japanese congregation. Some had started 10 years ago. One of the groups is for young adults called "Buddies" and meets once a month. They are led by three young adults in the church. The focus of these sessions have been to share their Christian faith through testimonies, Bible studies, and for general fellowship with non Christian friends.

One other small group we have continued is a study called "Firm Foundations - Creation to Christ". It is very important to learn the basic truth taught in the Bible for not only beginners but also advanced
